



- Fully digital mobility administration by 2025
- Timescale dependent upon users confirming the new systems are fit for purpose!

Indicative Timeline



The project will take 4 years overall ~ end 2025

- 1st phase: Inception/Analysis
- 2nd phase: Deployment in selected Erasmus+ HEIs
- 3rd phase: The European Student Card should be available in all Erasmus+ participating countries by 2025



What does the Erasmus+ App offers for students?

- **Structured information in 23 languages** about the different Erasmus+ mobility opportunities
- Mobility Journey guiding the student through all phases of mobility: before, during and after
- Tips, events, stories, discounts: information from other students and student organisations both in the feed and in the map view
- Online access point that centralizes access to services connected to the Erasmus+ programme (e.g. OLA, OLS)
- Providing <u>digital application</u> procedure for Erasmus+ study mobility participants through the App
- **Status updates and notifications** from relevant student services
- Support for generating a digital <u>European Student Card</u> through the App



Sharing HEI specific info in the App via the EWP Dashboard


- Sharing events and deals in the public feed
