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MASTER'S DISSERTATION AND INTERNSHIP



CURRICULUM IN EXCHANGE



- Master's dissertation: website Exchange curriculum
 - > Exchange course: 'Research in the framework of the Master's Dissertation'
 - Indicate that the subject 'Master's thesis' from your UGent programme is **partly** realised abroad.

Amount of credits?

- \rightarrow All your practical work on exchange \rightarrow 2/3 of the credits (20 out of 30)
- > Part of the practical work on exchange → 1/3 of the credits (10 out of 30)
- \triangleright Less than two months abroad \rightarrow 1 credit per week



CURRICULUM IN EXCHANGE



- Internship: website Exchange curriculum
 - > Exchange course: 'Practical training in the framework of the Internship'
- Partial realisation of a UGent course:
 - International internship (5 credits 20 working days)
 - > Extended international internship (10 credits 40 working days)
- Credits for the exchange course = Credits the internship course 2 (defence)




EXCHANGE FOR COURSES




2. PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

General courses

Mandatory to take up at UGent or partner institution

Elective courses



Freely selectable



2. PROGRAMME STRUCTURE: MASTER



- To be taken into account when putting together your programme
 - proposal (!)
 - > Min. 120 credits needed to obtain a Master's degree (less is not possible here!)
 - > You can choose whether to take a course from the 1st or 2nd master year
 - > You can take equivalent courses during an exchange in SEM1 for UGent courses in SEM2 (or vice versa)



EQUIVALENT COURSES



GENERAL COURSES

- What do you have to pay attention to?
 - > ALL final competences of these general courses (study file) must be obtained (either at UGent or at the host institution)
 - Equivalence is not required per course but can also be spread over several courses at the host institution (or vice versa)



ELECTIVE COURSES

- The exchange course you want to take as an elective does not have to correspond to a course from the elective list in the UGent study guide
- Open choice remains available at UGent after the exchange
- Language courses: max. 8 ECTS over the whole programme (with the approval of the chairman of your programme)



STUDY GUIDE PARTNER INSTITUTION



COURSES AT THE PARTNER INSTITUTION

- Which subjects are you allowed to take as an exchange student?
 - > Depends on host institution, but be sure to pay attention:
 - Guidelines for 'incoming exchange students' (see <u>Sharepoint</u>)
 - If agreement with one faculty/school of host institution: follow the rules of this faculty/school→ Not sure? Ask (<u>out.fbw@ugent.be</u>)
 - Usually you may combine courses from different programmes/faculties (see <u>Sharepoint</u>



or website exchange partner)

COURSES AT THE PARTNER INSTITUTION

- What is the best way to search for courses at the host institution?
 - > Example courses Sharepoint (not available for all institutions)
 - > Search within course of interest, faculty, department,...
 - Search within list of courses based on **important terms**(tip: use the English study file of the UGent course for correct terms)
 - > Ask questions in the Facebook group (community of ex-Erasmussers is growing)
 - > Mail to out.fbw@ugent.be for details of previous students (with approval)



MAKING UP A PROGRAMME PROPOSAL



WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

- Provides clear overview of your entire programme
- Handy to check if you meet all requirements
 - > Do you meet enough credits? Can you accommodate all general courses and electives within your study programme? ...
- Gives a clear overview of all equivalent courses

HOW DO I PUT TOGETHER MY PROGRAMME PROPOSAL?

- Enter in your template all the courses you want to take (at the host institution and at UGent)
- Name of the courses at the host institution
 - > Add a link to the study file via a hyperlink (How? Click here!)
- Indicate which courses you think you have an equivalent for
- Export your programme proposal template to **PDF** (for upload in Oasis)
- Stay within the limits of 2 pages (clearer)
- Make sure hyperlinks are clickable





HOW DO I PUT TOGETHER MY PROGRAMME PROPOSAL?

• To be included in the programme proposal:

- Target is 30 ECTS per semester BUT this is not compulsory (only for scholarship applicants outside EU)
 - → Min. ECTS for Erasmus scholarship = 27 ECTS
- > All credits taken at the partner institution are officially added to your curriculum at UGent
- The programme proposal **must be** signed by the <u>contact person of internationalisation</u> (deadline see further in the ppt)

 - Internship: Practical training in the framework of the Internship


OASIS: LEARNING AGREEMENT

- Learning Agreement is automatically completed with info from the completed curriculum in exchange (OASIS)
- After CIU's online approval in Oasis, a signature and stamp of UGent automatically appears on the document
 - >Still have to sign it yourself and send to partner for their signature

Courses
