

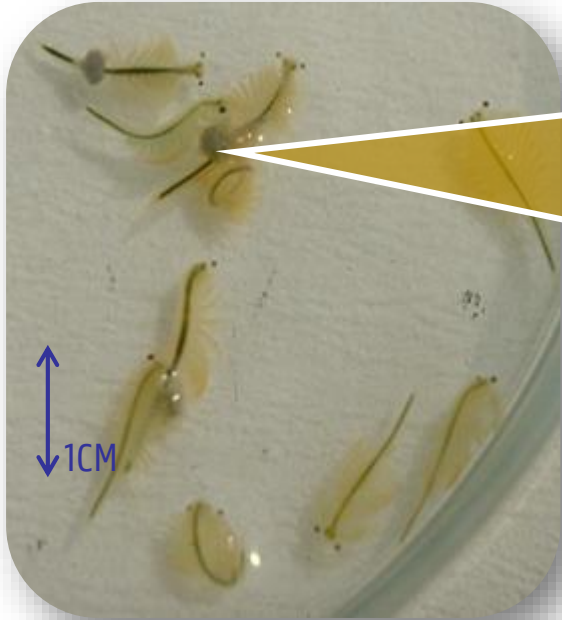

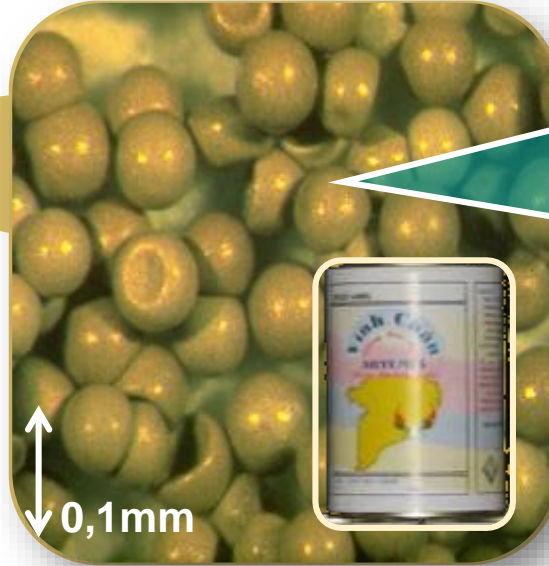


BACKGROUND

Artemia as alternative to live plankton in the farming of fish and shrimp



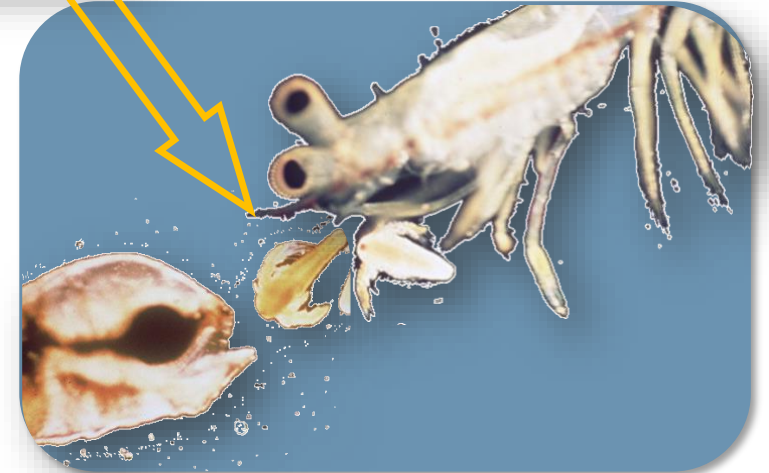
brine shimp - Artemia

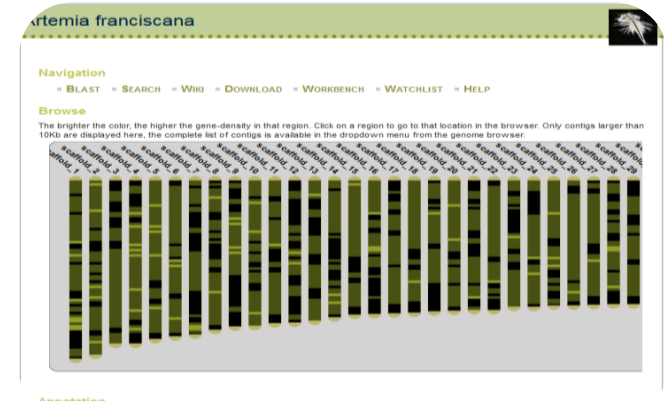

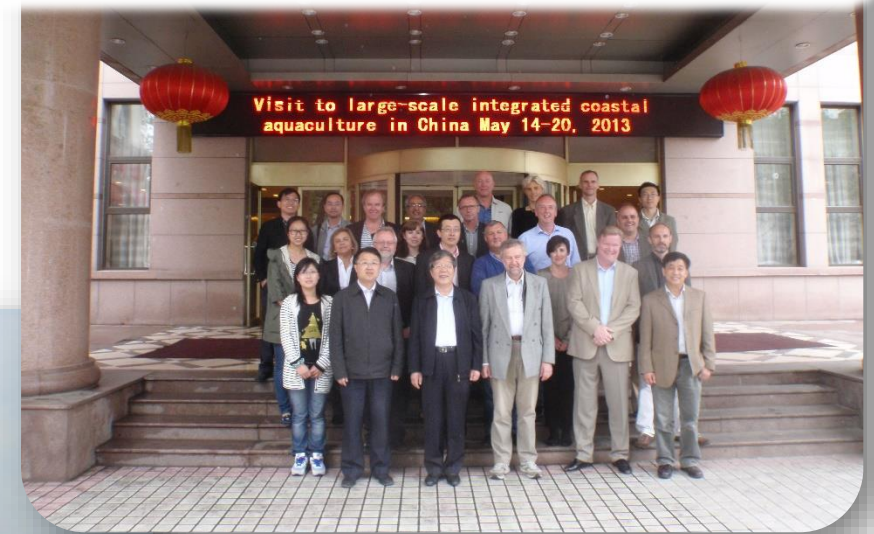

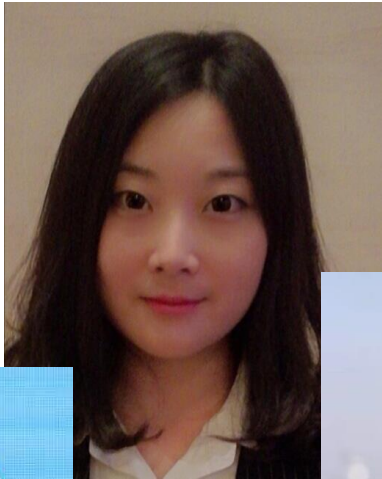
