Business Partnership Facility: Enterprises for SDGs

Support for 'civil society-enterprise' partnerships engaged in Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in developing countries, financed by the Belgian Directorate-General for Development (DGD).

On the initiative of, and with financing from the Belgian DGD, the Business Partnership Facility (BPF) awards subsidies to support and develop private sector involvement in SDGs in developing countries.

What does the BPF support ?

The BPF supports entrepreneurial partnerships between companies and actors from the Civil Society (CSO's) contributing to SDGs in developing countries on the <u>list of BIO-Invest</u>.

Two types of results should be achieved simultaneously: • Social impact: for example creation and maintenance of jobs, improvement in average income for families with low incomes, access to affordable goods and services for those on low incomes (by gender), inclusion and economic development of women and young people with low incomes, positive impact on the environment through saving resources, reducing CO2 emissions and by preserving biodiversity etc.

 Economic viability: partnerships must clearly explain how supported initiatives will become sustainable, present a competitive financial performance and show signs of potential scalability and replicability.

How does the BPF support ?


Project proposals can only be submitted online via the website of the KBF when a call for projects is open.

Twice a year an independent jury will select the best projects. Selected projects receive non-refundable funding between €50,000 to €200,000. The partnership receiving support must demonstrate that it provides an amount equal or more to the amount received.

In total, there is a budget of €12mio available to support projects and to manage the calls during 5 years.

The call for projects has been launched and will close on the 9th of September 2019.




















O Scholarships and grants for Flemish/European students

Travel grants for internships or research stays

EU students that are enrolled at a Flemish university or university college can apply for a grant for an internship or a research stay in one of the <u>31 scholarship countries and</u> <u>Suriname</u>, or India (only in 2017). The minimum stay is 28 consecutive days.



One of the requisites for the students is to have a

supervisor at the home institution and in the country of destination. The Flemish universities and university colleges are responsible for the selection and management of the grants.

Some examples of internships or research stays:

- placement in a hospital
- music education in a primary school
- research on the impact of national parks on the local population
- research into the control of agricultural pests
- research on the use of digital information channels
- research into creative ways to learn a foreign language

Special Research Fund - Doctoral Scholarships for **Candidates from Developing Countries**

With support from its "Special Research Fund" (BOF), Ghent University wishes to support university research groups or research centres in developing countries in their aim to grow into excellent research centres by upgrading local academic personnel. Therefore Ghent University grants PhD scholarships to promising PhD students from developing countries who wish to carry out half of their PhD research at Ghent University and half in a university in a developing country.

These grants take the form of a so called "sandwich" scholarship: the candidate obtains a scholarship for maximum 24 months to work within a span of 48 months on an alternating basis on the PhD at Ghent University ('North') and at the university or research centre in a developing country ('South'). Only for the periods the scholarship holder works at Ghent University the scholarship holder will receive a monthly income. The rest of the PhD research is done in the partner university, for which no funding is provided through this scholarship. For this part of the PhD research students must prove that they will be financed at their home university (e.g. fulltime PhD scholarship or salary).

No restrictions are imposed on the field of research, nevertheless preference will be given to topics that are relevant for development. Relevance for development measures the degree in which the action of development corresponds with the expectations of the beneficiaries, the needs of the country, global priorities and the policies of partners and donors.

The proposals must be submitted by a candidate, a promoter at Ghent University and a supervisor at the local institution.

Before applying students need to find a professor from Ghent University who is willing to act as the supervisor ('promoter') of their doctoral research and who agrees to support their application. The best way to do this is by browsing the list of faculties and research topics available on our research directory.
