

# Constitutional order of the Russian Federation and its adaptability to the Eurasian Economic Union

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# Constitution of Russia 1993

- Reflects western approaches to the foundations of the state power, human rights protection, basic principles of economy and law
- Provides a background for the Europeanization of Russian Law
- Contains 4 different approaches to the sovereignty

# Article 79

The Russian Federation may participate in interstate associations and transfer to them part of its powers according to international treaties and agreements, if this does not involve the limitation of the rights and freedoms of man and citizen and does not contradict the principles of the constitutional system of the Russian Federation.

# EAEU experience

- Based on the Custom Union
- Is not the USSR-2
- Is not similar with the EU

# Astana Treaty

- Is not a Constitution of Eurasia
- Denies the statehood of the EAEU
- “Vertical power structure” on the “third level” of power
- Union law

# Supranationality

- Does it exist in the EAEU?
- The EAEU court and the EEC as supranational bodies

# EAEU external competence

- “mimicry” of the EAEU competence
- the EU - EAEU relations

# EAEU Values

- The EAEU Treaty does not embody the EU values
- The other “space-time continuum” concept
- Dissonance with the Constitution 1993
