Mainstream popular representations of political violence tend to equate long-standing civil conflict with chaos and crime. Yet are they so by definition? By inviting outstanding international specialists with long-term field experience, the Conflict Research Group wants to offer an alternative reading of protracted conflict that starts from grounded observation and analysis. This will enable to counter the often speculative and sensational images of conflict by offering sophisticated analyses accounting for the diverse trajectories of conflict zones in the Global South and help to better understand what happens after peace agreements have been signed.
