Citing Your Sources: APA Style

The following are frequently used citation forms only. For more examples, see *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association* (BF76.7 .A51 2001). Keep up with what's new in APA style online at <www.apastyle.org>.

A Reference List, in alphabetical order at the end of a paper or chapter, has complete citations. Citations in Text, placed in the text, provide brief identification.

If you are using a typewriter instead of a word-processing program with italics, underline the italicized text. Always verify your citation formats with your instructor.

The following 2-column format is for illustration only. Do not place citations in text with the reference list at the end of your paper. Citations in text appear in the text only.
