

he **Migration Law Research Group** (MigrLaw) studies migration law and its daily practice from an integrated and critical approach, with a specific interest in human rights and users' perspectives.

We combine the doctrinal study of migration law with theoretical and methodological frameworks from other disciplines, including anthropology, sociology, political sciences, criminology as well as gender, queer, childhood and postcolonial studies. This involves a diversity of methods, ranging from case law analysis to interviews, ethnographic fieldwork, co-creative workshops, community-based participatory research and Knowledge, Attitudes and Practices (KAP) surveys.
